Lisa Peterson, County Social Services advised she and Supervisor Siepker attended a joint meeting with Humboldt and Wright County's representatives to discuss the new changes for the Mental Health Advocate position. The legislative changes to Iowa Code 229.9A become effective July 1, 2015 and require the person serving in this capacity prior to July 1, 2015 be appointed and compensated at a wage no less than prior to July 1, 2015. The three counties have shared the services of the Mental Health Advocate the past several years and the sharing of these services will continue. It was agreed by the three counties that the Advocate will be employed by Pocahontas County; with full administrative oversight of the position by the Pocahontas County Coordinator of Disability Services. RESOLUTION 2015-06-#22

WHEREAS, it is desired to authorize the county Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Basic Fund and Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund and from the General Basic Fund to the General Supplemental Fund during the fiscal budget year, and

WHEREAS, said transfers must be in accordance with Section 331.432 of the Code of Iowa,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Pocahontas County, IA as follows:

Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the General Basic Fund and the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 shall not exceed \$1,090,000.

Section 2. Within ten (10) days of being notified the apportionment of current property taxes and state replacement against property taxes, delinquent property taxes mobile home taxes, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said funds to the Secondary Road Fund.

Section 3. The amount of the transfer required by Section 2 shall be equal to the apportionment made under Section 2. respectively, multiplied by the ratio of said fund's total maximum transfer to the appropriate funds by the sum of said fund's total current property tax levy.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provision of Section 2 and 3 the amount of any transfer shall not exceed available fund balances in the transferring fund.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the provision of Sections 2 and 3 the amount of any transfer shall not exceed the amounts specified in Section 1.

Section 6. The Auditor is directed to adjust the books when said operating transfers are made and to notify the Treasurer and the County Engineer of the amount of said transfers.

It was moved by Siepker, seconded by Dewey to approve Change Order #2 for Healy Excavating for D.D. 29 and 29B. Ayes all, motion carried.

It was moved by Dewey, seconded by Peters to approve Pay Estimate #3 in the amount of \$1,114.24 to Healy Excavating for D.D. 29B. Ayes all, motion carried.

It was moved by Ives, seconded by Dewey to approve the claim of Pocahontas County Secondary Roads for repairs to Jt. D.D. 77 in Section 31, Garfield Township. Ayes all, motion carried.

It was moved by Peters, seconded by Siepker to acknowledge the following Manure Management Plan: Ekstrand Farms 1 facility - ID # 67371 located in SW SW, Section 36, Grant Township with Dean Ekstrand as owner and operator. Ayes all, motion carried.

Supervisor Dewey commented that he felt it would be helpful to have another person or two to be the contact for Century Link. A phone has been purchased for Emergency Management and Scott Telecommunications cannot install the phone until he has permission. Auditor Bunda advised that a staff person in my office also has authorization with Century Link and has been the person communicating with Century Link to clean up the many errors in our billing system; noting that a multi-line system like we have within the courthouse is managed through a service representative for our account and failing to use this representative makes another mess for us to get cleaned up. Unfortunately the communication process is slower as it moves through their system, once it gets to repairs the process is expedited.

Jack Moellering, County Engineer presented the contract for pavement markings. It was moved by Ives, seconded by Dewey to authorize the chairman to sign the contract with Vogel in the amount of \$74,847.63 to mark 182 miles. Ayes all, motion carried.

It was moved by Dewey, seconded by Siepker to authorize the chairman to sign the contact with Pro Coop in the amount of \$249,174.60 for FY 2016 fuels for the county. Ayes all, motion carried.
