Nannyberry



- Full sun/part shade
- Zone 2-7
- Height: 15-20 feet
- Spread: 10-15 feet
- Fast growth rate
- Prefers moist, rich soils, but is very adaptable - good for wetlands
- Flowers in May small, white, round-topped 3-5 inch clusters
- Frits in fall dark blue 2 inch clusters

- Need two plants for fruit
- Leaves red to deep maroon in fall - more vivid color if grown in full sun
- Can be pruned into a tree
- Good windbreak shrub
- Native
- Wildlife value: Good food and shelter. Edible fruits attract birds. Provides food and nesting habitat for songbirds such as gray catbird, common flicker, American robin, eastern bluebird, cedar waxwing, and other species
